Bob Geldof honoured with Lifetime Achievement accolade at Global Irish Diaspora Awards

The musician and activist described the Good Friday Agreement as a "reminder of what's possible when politics are done properly . . . Please make sure that we never, ever let this falter"

He also praised Ireland's response to the war in Ukraine. "I'm well aware of the number of Ukrainians the Irish have taken in and the strain it's taking upon the island and the people. But we will continue because it's right," said Geldof.

Maritime archaeologist Mensun Bound presented the award to the explorer's granddaughter, the Hon Alexandra Shackleton, who described his leadership as immortal.

Paul Coggins, of Tír Chonaill Gaels and London GAA, dedicated his Community Hero Award to his late wife. "She allowed me to do what I love to do, mainly football and helping out people," he said.

Eight nominated business accolades were also presented, including Business Leader of the Year to Jacqueline O'Donovan, managing director of O'Donovan Waste.

At the age of 19, following the death of her father, she took the family business from a turnover of £200,000 to £20 million.
